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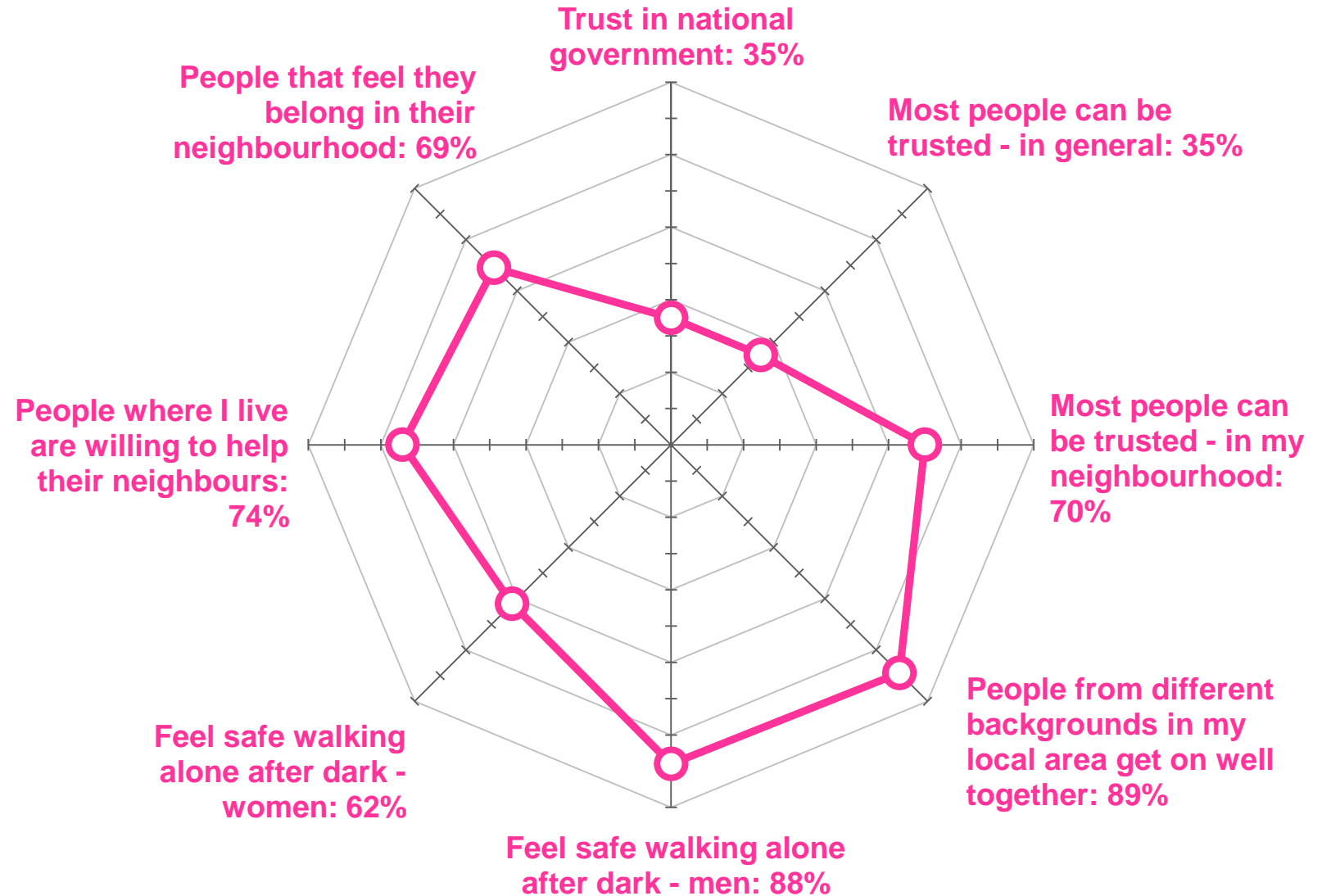

Measuring trust in the UK: the ONS' social capital indicator set on trust and cooperative norms

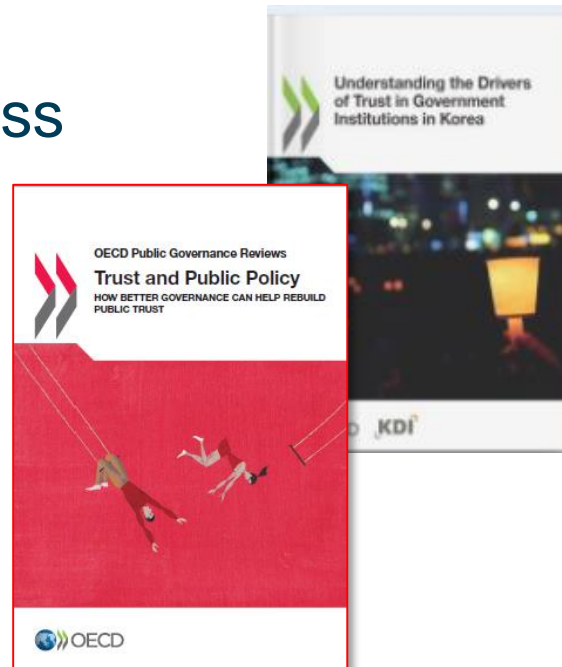

- Competence
 - Define a set of long term national priorities

- Values
 - Refine integrity framework
 - Move from consultation to meaningful engagement
 - Address concerns over fairness

Examples of What Works Network trials



Body cameras for the police

The world's largest RCT of body-worn cameras by police, involving 2,060 police officers working in Emergency Response Teams across ten London boroughs.



Free school breakfasts

A cluster RCT implemented in 100 primary schools, testing the effect of free, universal breakfast on pupil attainment.



Home adaptations for older people

Primary, qualitative research into the experiences of older people and care practitioners with regard to home adaptations.

Improving Confidence in Statistics

Improving confidence in statistics

- **Structural factors:** independence; legislation; ending pre-release access
- **Statistical factors:** code of practice; relevance
- **Reputational factors:** data ethics; communications strategy; challenging the misuse of Official Statistics
